

Not far from the Houses of Parliament there is Westminster Abbey. It was built by king Edward in 1065.




### Westminster Abbey is one of the oldest and most beautiful cathedrals of the world.




## The coronation of all British Kings and Queens takes place in Westminster Abbey.

#### The bridge opens and ships go up and down the River Thames.




One of the greatest English churches, Saint Paul's Cathedral, was built in the 17<sup>th</sup> century by famous British architect Sir Christopher Wren.
